## Embassy Coach/Limousine Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania



Embassy Coach/Limousine, the upscale ground transportation division of the Pittsburgh Transportation Group, is very active in its Pittsburgh community. The company provides transportation for the Make-A-Wish Foundation, raises funds for the Pittsburgh Hospice Association, and is a platinum alliance member of Mothers Against Drunk Driving. The company also donates the proceeds of its annual golf tournament to a local YMCA camp, Camp Kon-O-Kwee, which benefits special needs children. James "Jamie" Campolongo, president and CEO of the Pittsburgh Transportation Group, presented the camp with a check for \$15,000 in August 2007. Staff members in the company recently participated and raised the largest amount of "bail" in last year's Muscular Dystrophy Association Lockup. Finally, several senior board members generously donate their time to the board of the YMCA, Pittsburgh Downtown Partnership, and Visit Pittsburgh, of which Campolongo recently accepted a position on its board.

The Pittsburgh Transportation Group includes several divisions including airport shuttles, charter service, checker and yellow cabs, and wheelchair-accessible and passenger-assisted transportation, in addition to Embassy. Its shuttle service is the city's only service that visits all of the area's major hotels and convention centers. Embassy, which opened its doors in 1996, began as an airport-only company specializing as a door-to-door shared ride service. Today, the company is known in the Pittsburgh area as one of the most popular executive car services. Embassy's work also includes retail work, weddings, private parties, and large events. Its fleet of over 30 vehicles is primarily sedans, but also includes limousines, limobuses, and vans. Its oldest division, Yellow Cab Company, has been serving Pittsburgh since 1913. **LD**
